

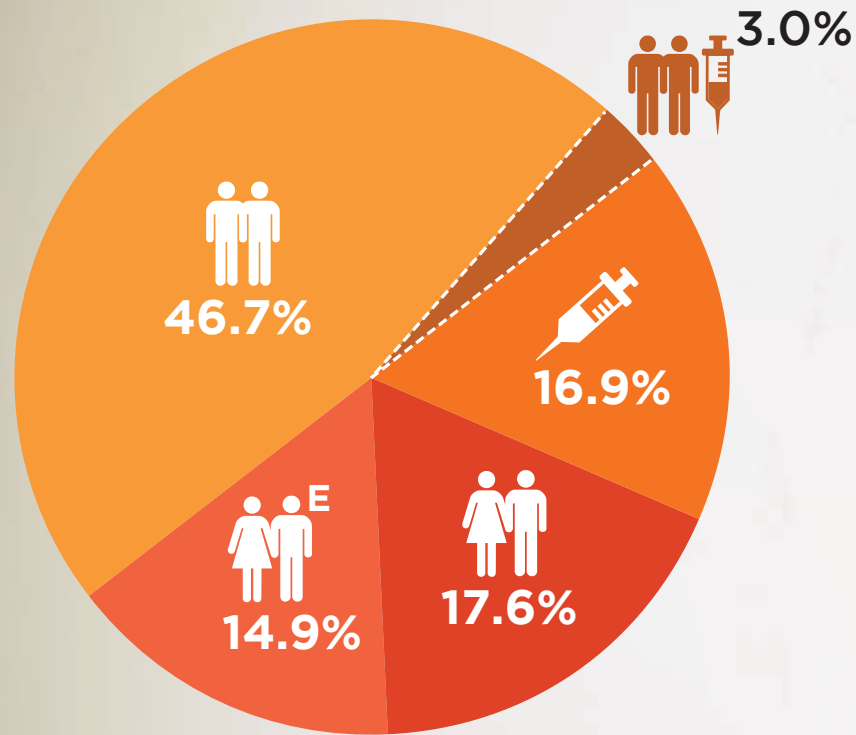

People who inject drugs



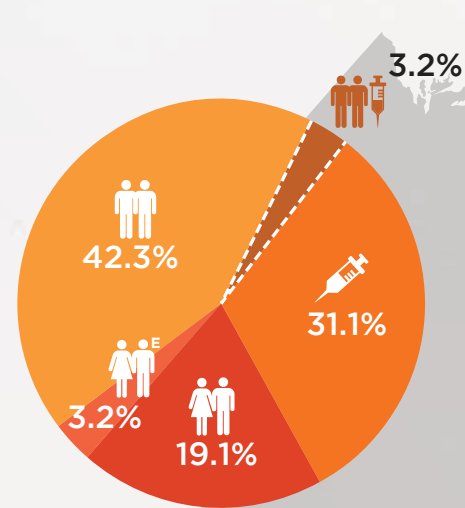
Heterosexual people, not including those born in countries where HIV is endemic



Heterosexual people born in countries where HIV is endemic

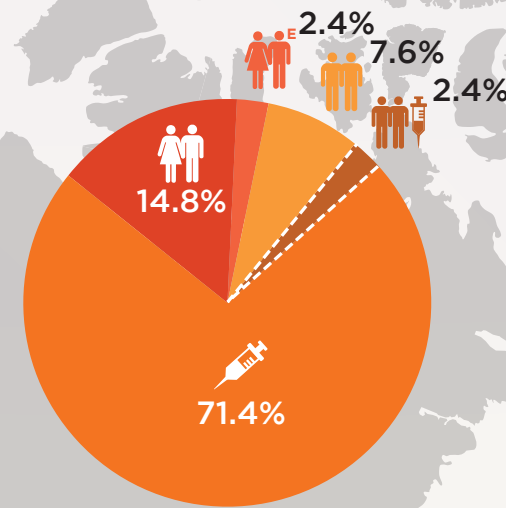
BRITISH COLUMBIA

An estimated 11,700 people living with HIV in 2011 (265.9 per 100,000 population)



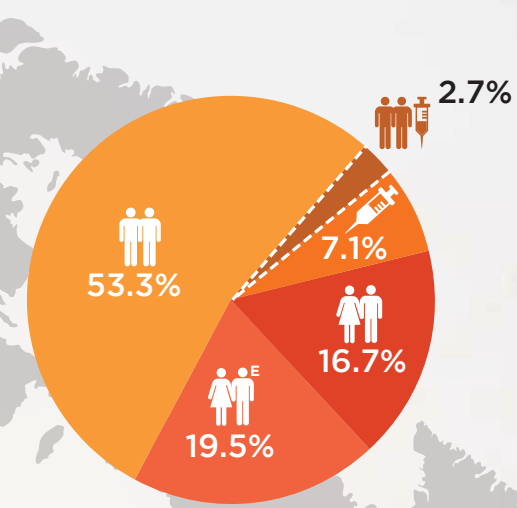
SASKATCHEWAN

An estimated 2,100 people living with HIV in 2011 (203.2 per 100,000 population)



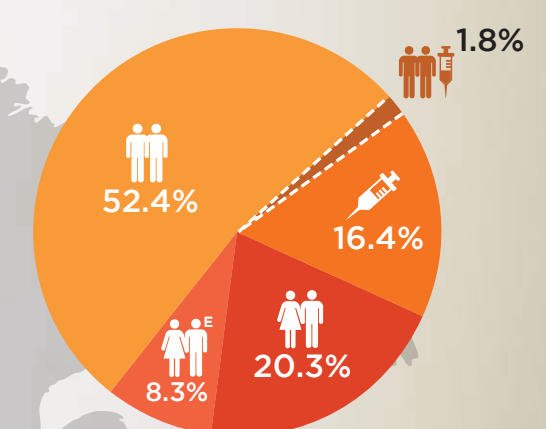
ONTARIO

An estimated 30,000 people living with HIV in 2011 (233.4 per 100,000 population)



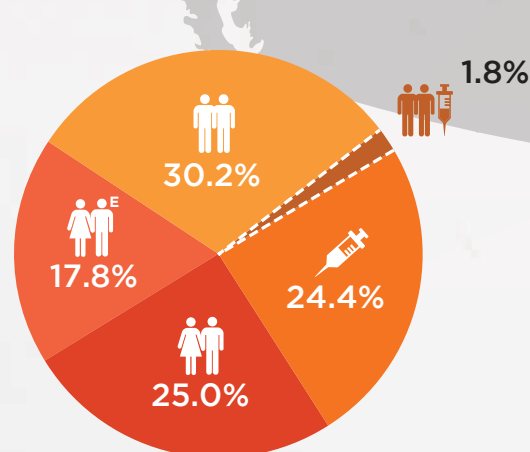
ATLANTIC CANADA

An estimated 990 people living with HIV in 2011 (42.5 per 100,000 population)



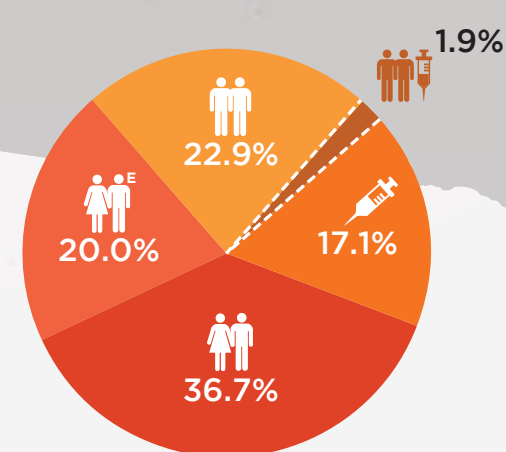
ALBERTA

An estimated 5,000 people living with HIV in 2011 (137.2 per 100,000 population)



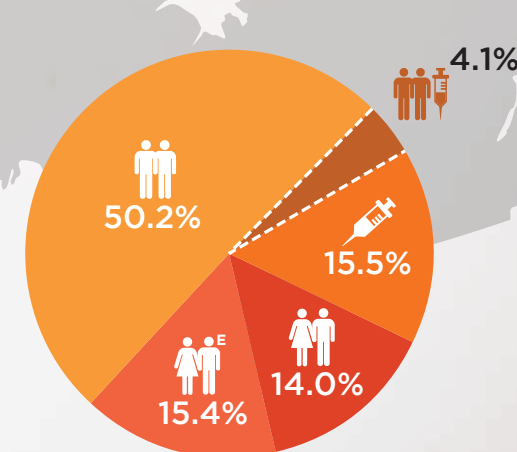
MANITOBA

Source: 2011 estimates from the Public Health Agency of Canada. Prevalence rates have been calculated using 2011 census data from Statistics Canada. Exposure categories are based on a hierarchical classification at the time of diagnosis. Figures do not add up to 100% as they do not include the negligible percentage from the exposure category of 'Other'.
