We do PHA tours (person having Aids) to the local communities. The speaker is an HIV+ person who has gone public and talks to the native bands, schools and general public in all the communities as well as Whitehorse. Our HPW (health promotion worker) also goes on these tours and discusses prevention to the same audiences. We also try to have a presence at all the local events such as the Dawson City Music Festival, Sourdough Rendezvous Festival, First Nations Hockey Tournament, etc.. We also conduct activities for World Aids Day, Aids Awareness Week and this year we may try to have an Aids Walk!

**HEALTH UNITS:**

Fifteen of the 27 Health Units have Indian Reserves within their boundaries. Both Calgary and Edmonton have a substantial number of Aboriginal people living within or in close proximity to their jurisdictions. Eleven of these 17 Health Units provide some services to Aboriginal people concerning HIV/AIDS. Most of these 11 Health Units provide services to Aboriginal people either by inviting people from the Reserve or Metis colonies to workshops being delivered at the Health Unit office, or by making presentations at Native Friendship Centres.

The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that, together, the 45 Indian Bands in Alberta have 68,247 Band members- 41,510 of these individuals are living on-reserve [61%], while 23,182 are living off-reserve [34%], while an additional 3,017 people are living either on a reserve set aside for another Band or on\* Crown land administered by an Indian Band [5%].

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Alberta East Central****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

The Health Unit reports that this area has a very small Aboriginal population.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

There is no programming specific to Aboriginals.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Alberta West Central****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

The Health Unit reports that there is a Metis community at Marlborough.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

There is no programming by the Health Unit which is specific to Aboriginal people. However, the Native Friendship Centre in Edson has requested a grant to conduct workshops targeted to Aboriginal youth. The workshops would include topics such as relationships, sexual violence, sexual stereotypes, alcohol and drugs, and social supports.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Athabasca****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

There are a large number of Aboriginal reserves in this part of the province, which are organised under the auspices of the Lesser Slave Lake Indian Regional Council [Driftpile, Duncan's Band, Horse Lake, Kapawe'no, Sawridge, Sturgeon Lake, Sucker Creek, Swan River, and Whitefish Lake]. The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that collectively the 9 Bands composing the Lesser Slave Lake Indian Regional Council have 8,009 Band members-2,902 of these individuals are living on-reserve, 4,996 are living off reserve, and an additional 1 1 1 people are living on a reserve set aside for another Band.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

The Health Unit staff has been invited into Aboriginal communities to make presentations concerning HIV/AIDS. Several young people appreciate the danger that HIV/AIDS brings to the community and they want to know how to protect themselves. The Health Unit staff note that, through an informal telephone survey in the summer of 1993, the people off-reserve have either limited or no access to condoms. That is, people who want condoms have to drive to the store located between Trout Lake and Peerless Lake. In Chip Lake condoms were not available in the summer of 1993. In the Metis settlement at Buffalo Lake individuals are becoming more vocal about the need for education about HIV/AIDS and want to deal with their concerns.

The Lesser Slave Lake Indian Regional Council, which includes Metis, Non-Treaty and Treaty Aboriginal people has agreed to sponsor education, and support for people who are infected. The Council covers the Treaty 8 area and they have applied for Federal funding. The Health Unit does not sit on the Council but does have representation on the committee which is concerned with HIV/AIDS.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Drumheller****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

The Health Unit reports that there are few Aboriginals in the area other than those living on the Siksika Reserve near the Strathmore office. The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that the Siksika Reserve has 4,355 Band members-2,510 of these individuals are living on-reserve, 1,759 are living off-reserve, and an additional 86 Band members are living on a reserve set aside for another Band.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

The Health Unit does not go on to the reserve. There are some Aboriginal students in the schools but the regular curriculum concerning HIV/AIDS is used but nothing specific to Aboriginals.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Edmonton****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

According to "Tracking the Trends", there were 42 695 Aboriginal people living in Edmonton in 1991[Aboriginal is defined as "ethnic origin"-i.e. Aboriginal by blood].

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

There is no programming by the Health Unit which is specific to Aboriginals. However, approximately 50% of the people using the Needle Exchange Program in Edmonton are Aboriginal.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Foothills****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

The Health Unit reports that there is a limited Aboriginal population other than on the Eden Valley Reserve [500 Band members] which is within the Foothills Health Unit area.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

There is no programming which is specific to Aboriginals. Although the Health Unit staff do not go on to the reserve, they have sent posters concerning HIV/AIDS to the Eden Valley Reserve.

## **NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Fort McMurray**

### **ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

The reserves of Fort McKay, Janvier, Fort McMurray First Nation, and Fort Chipewyan reserves are within the Health Unit area, as are the Metis Settlements of Anzac and Conklin. The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that the Fort McKay, Janvier, Fort McMurray First Nations and Fort Chipewyan have a total of 3,369 Band members 1,405 of these individuals are living on-reserve, 2,131 are living off-reserve, and an additional 33 are living on a reserve set aside for another Band.

### **EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

Education concerning HIV/AIDS is provided by staff of the Fort McMurray Health Unit in the schools at Fort McKay, Janvier, Gregoire Lake, Anzac and Conklin. The Bands have also requested education to adults about HIV/AIDS.

There is an STD clinic in Fort McMurray which offers the same services as other STD clinics elsewhere in the province.

There are four schools up to grade 8 where there is an introduction to STD and HIV/AIDS as part of Human Sexuality. The same pamphlets are used as in the regular school system as well as the video, "Sex, Drugs and AIDS". These schools are in Conklin, Fort McKay, Anzac and Janvier and the vast majority of the students are Aboriginal.

The video "Kecia", about a Aboriginal girl's life story about AIDS is available to the teachers. Although only a few teachers have used the video, those that have find it to be a valuable resource.

The Health Unit makes regular presentations at the Mark Aimie Centre at Anzac. This Centre is a 28 day treatment centre for people with drug and alcohol problems. The speaker may begin talking about drugs and alcohol but this soon leads into a discussion about STD and AIDS.

Approximately once a year, staff from the Fort McMurray Health Unit make a presentation at Second Chance and at the YMCA. The video "Sex, Drugs and AIDS" is incorporated into the presentation. Second Chance is a non-structured opportunity for drop-outs to get a high school diploma. There are always lots of questions as the young people are interested in the topic of HIV/AIDS.

In the spring of each of the past three years there has been an AIDS forum in Fort McMurray. The Interagency AIDS Committee brings in guest speakers as well as people who are HIV positive. About 250 people from the general public attend. At the last forum Kecia, who is in her mid-twenties, was the guest. Mainly women came out to get information because they are worried about their children.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-North Eastern Alberta****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

The reserves in the area include Saddle Lake, Goodfish, Kehewin, Cold Lake and Frog Lake. The Health Unit reports that there are Metis colonies at Fishing Lake, Kikino and Elizabeth.

The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that the Saddle Lake, Cold Lake and Frog Lake Reserves have a total of 9,581 Band members-6,396 of these individuals are living on-reserve, 2,988 are living off-reserve, and an additional 197 people are living on a reserve set aside for another Band.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

The Health Unit staff goes to Saddle Lake about twice a year to talk to the teens concerning AIDS, STD, risks and protection.

Throughout the past four years, staff from the North Eastern Alberta Health Unit have made presentations to local Aboriginal groups concerning HIV/AIDS at the Manniwani Centre in St. Paul.

The Health Unit staff have also been invited to talk to the Aboriginal women at the Alberta Vocational Centre who are upgrading their education. The Health Unit staff talk about sexuality generally, sexual roles and submission and dominance in a relationship.

Throughout the past three years, the Health Unit staff have made presentations to teenagers at the Poundmaker's Lodge Adolescent Alcohol and Drug Abuse Treatment Centre. They discuss HIV, safer sex behaviours, attitudes and addictive behaviour.

The Health Unit staff have also made presentations concerning STD at Ashmont Junior High and the High School (grades 8 and 9). Both of these schools are about 65% Aboriginal. In addition, the Health Unit staff have talked to the Aboriginal students at Racette Junior High in St. Paul. During these presentations, the Health Unit staff discuss date abuse, taking advantage of people, assertiveness, and safer sex practices.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Lethbridge****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

There are no reserves in the Lethbridge Health Unit. However, the Blood Reserve is located in close proximity to the Lethbridge Health Unit. The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that the Blood Reserve consists of 7,717 Band members-6,176 of these individuals are living on-reserve, 1,522 reside off-reserve, and an

additional 19 are living on a reserve set aside for another Band. It is likely that a portion of the people from the Blood Band who are live off-reserve, reside in the City of Lethbridge.

#### EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS

The Health Unit, does not go on to the reserves. There is no programming by the Health Unit which is specific to Aboriginals.

#### **NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Minburn-Vermilion**

##### ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA

There are no reserves located in the Minburn-Vermilion Health Unit area.

#### EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS

There is no programming specific to Aboriginals.

#### **NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Peace River**

##### ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA

Several Reserves are located within the Peace River Health Unit area, including Caddotte Lake, Little Buffalo, Horse Lakes, Grouard, Atikemeg, Sucker Creek, Duncan, and Loon River. The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code were available for the following Bands from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs: Horse Lakes, Sucker Creek, Duncan, and Loon River. The data indicate that for these four Bands there are 2,528 Band members-761 living on-reserve, 31 living on Crown land other than a reserve, and 1,736 are living off-reserve. According to Health Unit staff, there are other communities within the Peace River Health Unit jurisdiction that have a significant Aboriginal population such as High Prairie, Grouard, Peavine, Enilda, Keg River, Loon Lake, and East Prairie.

#### EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS

The Peace River Health Unit staff do not go on to the reserves. However, all Band members receive services from the Peace River Health Unit staff if it is accessed off-reserve. This includes school education, health promotion activities and immunisation clinics. The exception to this policy is the full-time nursing and Community Health Representative positions in Caddoffe Lake. The Peace River Health Unit provides the staffing for these positions as agreed to by the Woodland Cree Band and the Peace River Health Unit Board. The Community Health Nurse and the CHR provide the health promotion and communicable disease control programs, which includes HIV/AIDS education and awareness.

The Health Unit staff provide school divisions with audio-visual teaching aids and other health education material upon request. A large proportion of Aboriginal children from the reserves attend school off-reserve and, therefore, receive the curriculum as mandated by Alberta Education. Health Unit staff or teachers may deliver the service depending upon the school and its needs.

The towns of High Prairie and Peace River have had health committees which include Health Unit staff. There have been HIV/AIDS public awareness initiatives sponsored by these groups. The target audience also includes the Aboriginal population throughout the area. As much as possible the education resources that are obtained specifically for the Aboriginal population are appropriate in language and presentation. The community, Council members in each area are approached by the Health Unit staff prior to beginning any education and they assist in the development and implementation of any health promotion programming.

Pauline Johnson in Slave lake uses the Sweet Grass ceremony and the Circle of Healing as the main focus for presentations on HIV/AIDS.

### **NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-South Peace**

#### **ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

Horse Lake Reserve and Sturgeon Lake Reserve are within the Health Unit area. There are other Aboriginal communities within the area, resulting in a fairly large Aboriginal population. The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that Horse Lake Reserve has 470 Band members-221 of these individuals are living on-reserve and 243 are living offreserve. In addition, the Sturgeon Lake Reserve has 1,626 Band members-676 living on-reserve and 949 living off-reserve.

#### **EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

The Sexual Health Program of the South Peace Health Unit works closely with the South Peace AIDS Council. The Health Unit goes into the schools to talk about Human Sexuality. This includes the East Smokey School District in Valleyview and the Spirit River School District. The Health Unit staff do not teach sexuality education on the reserves.

The Health Unit has been invited to the Native Friendship Centre in Grande Prairie to discuss STD and HIV/AIDS. The South Peace Health Unit staff have been interested in going to Aboriginal communities, and would do so, on a request basis.



**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Sturgeon**

Alexander Reserve is in the Sturgeon Health Unit area. The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that the Alexander Band has 1,178 Band members-666 of these individuals are living on-reserve, 468 are living off-reserve, and an additional 45 are living on a reserve set aside for another Band.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

The Sturgeon and Athabasca Health Units provide "outreach" services part-time concerning HIV/AIDS in the rural areas of their Health Units. The outreach worker helps with family members of people who have died of AIDS as well as infected persons. Three of the seven people on the caseload are Aboriginal and are all off the reserve. The newly formed Northern AIDS Society, based in Slave Lake, is called Nipoaspinewin. Its mandate is to provide education, counselling and support to Aboriginal people in Northern Alberta. The organisation is now applying for funding.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Vegreville****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

The Health Unit reports that there are no high concentrations of Aboriginals in the area.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

There is no HIV/AIDS education program designed for Aboriginals. Staff from the Vegreville Health Unit do make presentations in the schools once or twice a year concerning HIV/AIDS. There are very few Aboriginals in the schools.

**NAME OF HEALTH UNIT-Wetoka****ABORIGINAL POPULATION WITHIN HEALTH UNIT AREA**

The Hobbema Reserve is located in the Wetoka Health Unit area and there are some Aboriginals living in Wetaskiwin. The Hobbema Reserve is comprised of the Four Bands [total 8,721 Band members]- Samson [4,572 Band members]; Ermineskin [2,371 Band members]; Louis Bull [1,181 Band members]; and Montana [597 Band members].

The January 1994 Population Statistics by Residence Code from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs indicate that the Hobbema Reserve has 8,721 Band members-6,633 of these individuals are living on the reserve, 1,555 people are living off-reserve, and another 533 Band members are living on a reserve set aside for another Band.

**EXTENT OF HEALTH UNIT INVOLVEMENT WITH ABORIGINALS CONCERNING HIV/AIDS**

The staff of the Wetoka Health Unit do not provide service on the reserve. The Hobbema Indian Health Services is on the reserve and most Aboriginals use the Hobbema Indian Health Centre if they have a health concern. There is regular communication between all levels of staff-this includes employees of MSB (Public Health Nurses) the Four Bands, as well as the Wetoka Health Unit. Clients who seek services at the Wetoka Health Unit, but live on reserve, are referred to the Hobbema Indian Health Centre.
