They each deal with an HIV/AIDS related subject such as injection drug use, pregnancy and HIV/AIDS, and so

on. These spots have been produced to be individually used rather than to be listened to one after another. The transcripts for the French and English spots are included.

This documentary gives a short history of the development of blood transfusion focusing on the work done by the Canadian Red Cross during the Second World War. What follows is an examination of what went wrong with the blood system in Canada in the early 1980's and into the 90's when thousands of Canadians were infected with HIV and hepatitis C through tainted blood. The documentary suggests that officials were aware of testing precautions that could have prevented the spread of these diseases as early as 1981. The director examines how politics and budgets affected the decision-making process.

The video offers basic first aid information for children, including nosebleeds, cuts, scratches, burns and eye injuries. It provides information about using 9-1-1 and the importance of getting assistance from an adult. It also stresses to the children that they shouldn't touch the blood of another person.

It provides suggestions for caregivers of HIV-positive children 14 and under about where to find information and support for: helping children adhere to and tolerate difficult medication regimens; coping with and treating mental health issues like anxiety, grief over the loss of family members, attachment and adjustment disorders; and disclosing HIV status to the infected child, family, friends and community. The video also shows the benefits of caregiver support groups, individual counselling for caregivers and children, and other support services. The booklet contains additional information about mental health services, professionals and places to look for help.

Since the advent of this life-threatening disease, the bats pay strict attention to the new law: their nightly harvest of blood must be purified by fire. This is the story of Desmine and Modus, who have neglected to take the necessary precautions and risk finishing their days in the sinister branches of the dead tree.
